Class Selection Guide

These are the classes being offered for St. Patrick Summer School 2019. Be sure to check the age and session availability of each. Some classes have limited space so students will be assigned on a first come first serve basis. A class may be cancelled if there is a lack of sign ups. **Students referred by teacher or principal must attend 4 one week Sessions of Math and Language Arts Workshop.**

TK/K/1 Themes – Classes will focus on the themes indicated each week and will involve a series of math, reading, and writing activities, art projects, music, hands on science experiments, and class presentations

- **Polynesian Paradise** – Tropical music and dance, water play, tropical foods, pineapple art; Final Activity: Polynesian Dance Show
- **America the Beautiful** – Understanding national symbols, trying national foods, learning state facts, exploring national parks; Final Activity: 4th of July parade
- **Emerging Artists** – explore art design, learn about different artists; Final Activity: Art Gallery Opening
- **Under the Sea** – Explore wave science, float and sink activities, water conservation, crab walk, includes a water day; Final Activity:
- **Starry Starry Night** – Homemade s'mores, star gazing, constellations, glow in the dark party, camping in the classroom; Final Activity: Camp Jamboree
- **It's a Small World** – International music, puppet theater performance, create a tapestry of diversity, cooking cultural foods, making flags, cultural dance, map reading and making; Final Activity: Puppet Theater Performance
- **Peter Pan's Adventureland** – Treasure Hunts, Pirate Hats, Balloon Artists, pirate boat building, costume dress up day; Final Activity: Pirate Songs and oem Performance
- **Imaginarium** – designing and building, marshmallow architecture, fingerprint art, special inventors, Makers Space activities; Final Activity: Invention Showcase
- **How to Train Your Dragon** – Fairies and dragons, castle building, making shields, family crest, puppet theater; Final Activity: Castle Display

Language Arts Remediation - This 3-8 class will focus on both reading and writing components during the week. Students will use Lexia for basic skill strengthening. Students will read and interpret short stories, work on reading comprehension, and learn to identify different parts of a piece of writing while enjoying and interpreting the meaning of the work. **Remedial (Teacher Recommended)**

Math Remediation - Students will learn to improve problem-solving techniques through manipulative and cooperative learning strategies. Emphasis will be on addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, patterns, measurement, time, and money. Students will use ALEKS and Kahn Academy to strengthen skills. **Remedial (Teacher Recommended)**

Summer Intensive - During each one week, session students will study techniques of acting and dance, memorize lines, learn songs, and prepare for a culminating performance at 1:00 pm on Friday. This class is open to incoming 6-8th graders only. Each session (1&2) stands alone with a 1:00 pm performance on the Friday afternoon of each week.

Gonna Go Hawaiian – During this week students will study the value of Aloha (one of unconditional love.) They will make sand volcanoes, learn to hula, make tissue flowers, listen to Hawaiian music, create totem poles, and culminate their week with a luau party.

Mind Body Spirit - Students will be introduced to a psychological look at personality, human nature, and why we do what we do. Student will take hands-on assessments and explore their color type, Enneagram Personality, Myers Briggs type, and more. Yoga and meditation will be explored along with spiritual reflection practices from around the world.

Play Production Grades 3-6 During this one week session, students will memorize lines, make costumes and scenery, and learn dances for a mini musical production of **School House Rock**.

Get Ready for Middle School - Test Taking/Study Skills Strategies Grades 5-8 This class will help students understand how to break apart test questions to understand what questions are being asked, in order to choose appropriate test answers. As students move into the upper grades, it becomes even more critical that they have the study

skills to handle the workload. This class will also teach the basics needed to be successful: setting goals, organization, time-management, note taking, reading habits and speed, critical dictionary skills, test-taking, and vocabulary in context. Students will keep a record of all information shared and will have this in place the next academic year.

Sports Camp - Spend a week enjoying a variety of sports activities including Relay Races, Kickball, Volleyball, soccer, baseball, and more!

How Does Your Garden Grow? – Enjoy a week learning the ins and outs of gardening. Students will plant their own garden, harvest vegetables, cook with the veggies gathered, and take hikes to learn about vegetation. The week will end with an old fashion “picnic.”

Around the World in 80 Days - Students will begin the week creating a passport to adventure. They will then explore various cultures including Japan (with Koi Fish Water color and salt art,) Germany (learning about the Berlin Wall,) Mexico (creating confetti bowls and making salsa,) and Italy (making individual pizzas.)

STEM Robotics and Coding Camp – Learn the basics of coding in order to make your own 3 D Model, program a robot or Sphero to perform a variety of tricks!, or how to program a Raspberry Pi to create your own interactive computer device in this interactive and hands-on class! Students will also learn how to code using Python – a coding language used to develop games and other online interactions!

The Wizarding World of Harry Potter – Calling all Muggles! Come join the wizarding world of Harry Potter where you will learn to make mystical potions, identify unusual horticulture, maybe even tame a dragon! Students will design and build Hogwarts Castle and compete to see which design stands up best.

Incredible Edible Science – Ever wonder what makes popcorn pop? Or why cake rises? Or how jelly gels? In this class, the kitchen will be turned into a laboratory worthy of a mad scientist as you conduct experiments you can eat. At the end of your day at the lab, you will enjoy your results: cupcakes, peanut brittle, all kinds of tasty delights.

Let’s Go Camping – Let’s go camping right here at school. Students will enjoy “camp” activities including creating and playing camp “games,” creating a solar oven to make your own s’mores, “hiking” and outdoor exploration, and making fun crafts throughout the week.

Science Rocks Students will learn about the rock cycle, earthquakes, and volcanoes through hands on exploration and science experiments.

Middle School Math Prep – get ready for Middle School Math with this two week refresher course. Hone your math skills and be ready for the first day of school.

Saint Pats Top Chef – Students will learn to make a complete days worth of meals – breakfast, lunch, dinner, appetizer/snack, and dessert. Kitchen prep and cooking skills will be demonstrated and practiced. Students will also create a recipe book to take home at the end of the session. Of course the real fun is eating everything they make!!

Upcycled Eco-Crafts - Recycling is good, but upcycling is better! Upcycling is taking something we normally recycle and transforming it into something more valuable. This class will provide a variety of material choices, including textiles, paper, and junk-drawer odds and ends. Students will learn how to use readily available materials to make useful and artful items such as, bookmarks, tote bags, jewelry, bowls, and “junk-drawer” sculptures. Students will learn skills such as sewing by-hand, paper mache, and working with simple tools and hardware. Emphasis will be on the creative design process, prototypes and writing how-to instructions. Students will work in design teams or individually. Projects will be displayed in a gallery walk at the Upcycle Fair at the end of the week.

Backyard Beach Bash – Sand Castles, seashells, beach volleyball-Oh My! Enjoy a week filled with beach activities including learning about waves, creating sand art, having a “sand” volleyball game, and more.
